

Intellectual Property and Personal Images

Most of the projects supported by the Foundation entail the production of intellectual property, such as articles, analytical reports, training courses and programs, original methodologies, audiovisual works, museum displays, exhibitions, books, research and similar.

We comply with intellectual property, copyright and related rights rules in our practices. We expect our grantees to do the same, also with respect to their partners, contractors and any third parties.

The exclusive rights to the results of intellectual activities created as part of the implementation of the projects supported by the Foundation always belong to the Foundation's grantees – the authors and the organizations they represent.

The Foundation reserves the right to publish and distribute information materials about the supported projects for the purpose of informing the public. The selection of materials shall be based on the results of project monitoring, including visits to grantee organizations, participation in their events, as well as on data of digital monitoring: grantees' publications, submitted project diaries and reports, along with public information.

We use the grantees' outputs of intellectual activity for project coverage free of charge under a general (non-exclusive) license.

The Foundation and its grantees also license each other the right to use their images and logos on each other's official websites and project materials published and publicized.

We also adhere to the rules of copyright and related rights as well as protection of individuals' images, and therefore, in keeping with Articles 431.2 and 152.1 of the Civil Code of the Russian Federation, we ask all grantees to give assurances to the Foundation that:

- all necessary permits and approvals will be obtained for the use of names, titles, literary works, trademarks and service marks, emblems (logos), video and photographic materials and other intellectual products and equivalent means of individualization for the purposes of the grant agreement;
- all necessary consents will be obtained from individuals to be photographed and videotaped, to have their photographs and video recordings taken/received in the course of project implementation made public and utilized.
